

Admission Procedure

The faculty determines the admission procedure

- The Admissions and Academic Progress Committee will determine procedures for acting on all applications for admission to the college. The VP of Admissions will communicate the decision to the applicant.

Procedure passed on 9/26/01

Recommendation regarding Success Scores:

The faculty would like to look at ways both to bring in more students, and to improve the academic profile of Waldorf's student body, by focusing on attracting better students.

For this reason they recommend the following:

- The success score will not be used to determine whether a student should be admitted to the college. It will be used only to assess trends in the student academic profile.
- Applying students who are below a 19 ACT and/or below a 2.00 G.P.A. should be considered individually for admission by the Admissions and Academic Progress Committee.
- The number of students with a 19 ACT and below a 2.00 GPA shall not constitute more than 10-15% of the freshman class
- The faculty will produce a plan to improve the academic profile. This will be done through discussions at divisions, faculty forum meetings, and then sent to a faculty task force which will present a recommendation to the Strategic Planning Committee.
