A New Year's Message from President Alsop



New Year's is a time of reflections, and it seems especially appropriate this year. Waldorf University just completed its first year under the ownership of the non-profit, Waldorf Lutheran College Foundation. We announced this change of ownership with a vision that would ensure the **vitality** of a Waldorf education for generations to come. It is a vision with a **thriving campus** with very little debt; a vision with **expansive online programs** that bring a uniquely Waldorf educational experience to students around the world; a vision with a vibrant advancement office **engaging with alumni, parents, and friends** in support of Waldorf's mission.

In the last year we have made remarkable strides in realizing this vision. Our campus enrollment this fall was our third largest since the 1970's. Our historic debt has been reduced to 3 million dollars, along with a commitment from the Hanson Family Foundation to retire the entirety of that principal in less than three years. Our online programs continue to create partnerships with:

- 1. Industry, such as graduate certificates we developed with Pearson Publishing;
- 2. The government, with a Waldorf presence at two military bases; and
- 3. Non-profits, such our concentration in Social Emotional Learning developed with Erin Gruwell and the Freedom Writers.

Combining our residential and online enrollments, Waldorf is now the **third largest private college** in the state of lowa. The response from our alumni, parents, and friends to the change in ownership has been overwhelming. The assets of the Waldorf Lutheran College Foundation have more than doubled from a year ago to more than \$13M. The vision is to double that again in the next few years to create a substantial endowment. The initial support has been tremendous.

The distinctive Waldorf experience rests with a simple word: AND. Our faculty and staff embrace this concept to make sure our students can be successful both inside and outside the classroom. Virtually all of Waldorf campus students are involved in a scholarship activity, whether that be football, theatre, choir, campus ministry, creative writing club,

etc. These students want a quality education AND to follow their passions outside the classroom. Our Waldorf online students also seek the AND. They want a quality education AND to be a spouse, parent, professional, servicemember, or community member. Our flexible online courses and supportive faculty and staff allow them to do just that. Now many schools have activities that students participate in, but we do it better at Waldorf. We embrace this AND for all of our students because it is central to our **mission** of "educating the entire person."

2023 was undoubtedly a banner year for Waldorf, but I am even more excited for what we will be able to accomplish in coming years. We are grateful for all the ways you have supported Waldorf through this transition and wish you a joyful and prosperous 2024.




A Window of Opportunity!
